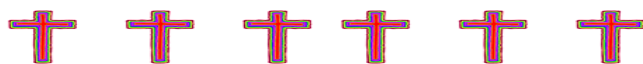
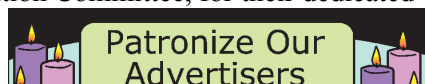
Catholic Daughters of the America,

loss of parents; people rejected by
religious orders; sick people; sickness

Mariana was born at Quito, Ecuador of noble Spanish parents. Early in her life, Mariana was attracted to all things religious. Mariana practiced the greatest austerities, had the gift of prophesy, and performed miracles. When an earthquake shook Quito in 1645, she offered herself as a victim for the sins of the people. She became ill and died on May 26th. She is often called "the lily of Quito." She was canonized in 1950.

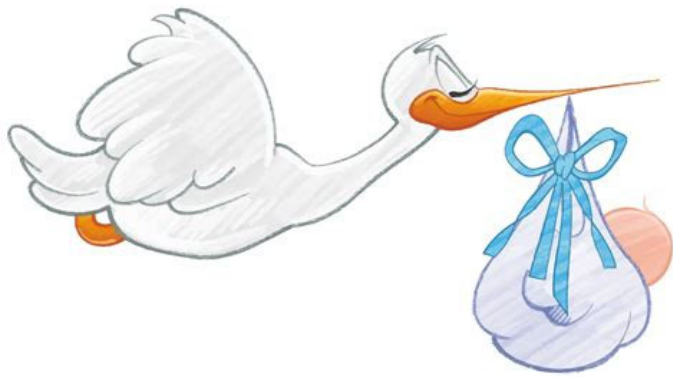
